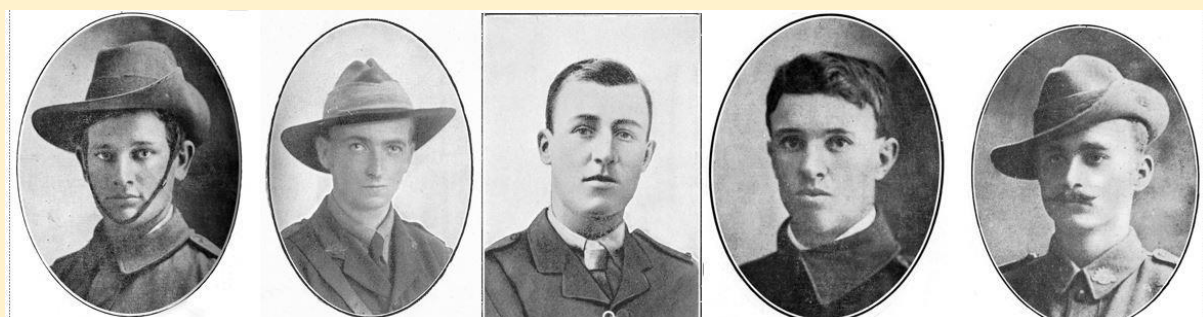
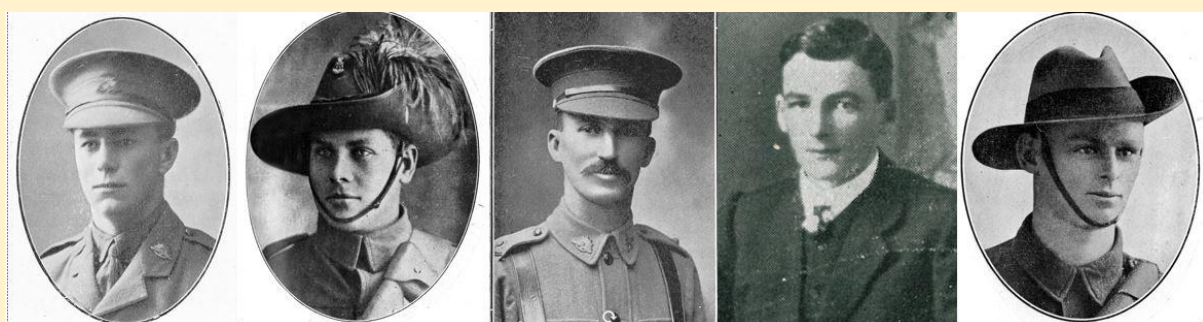

|  <p>Frederick George Pitty Barbour<br/>[Australian War Memorial]</p>           | <p>Born 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1895 in Sydney, he matriculated March 1915. He came to UQ on an Open scholarship. While in high school he won an athletic prize for best all round athlete. He enlisted on 3<sup>rd</sup> August 1915 in the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on 30<sup>th</sup> December 1915. He was promoted Corporal on 12<sup>th</sup> September 1916 and Company Quartermaster Sergeant on 16<sup>th</sup> October 1916. Died of wounds at the age of 21 in Flers, France, on the 25<sup>th</sup> February 1917.</p>  |
|  <p>Sydney Stanna Bond<br/>[Australian War Memorial]</p>                       | <p>Born 29<sup>th</sup> July 1895 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1914 in Arts. Enlisting on 20<sup>th</sup> March 1915 in the 25<sup>th</sup> Battalion he embarked for active service on 29<sup>th</sup> June 1915 but returned to Australia due to sickness, eventually re-embarking on 4<sup>th</sup> May 1916. He was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on 20<sup>th</sup> March 1915 and promoted to Lieutenant on 26<sup>th</sup> June 1915. He was promoted to Captain on 8<sup>th</sup> January 1917 and was killed in action at the age of 24, in Belgium, on the 9<sup>th</sup> October 1917.</p> |
| <p>Philip Gerald Browne</p>   | <p>Born 8<sup>th</sup> June 1895 in Taroom, he matriculated March 1914 in Arts. He enlisted on 24<sup>th</sup> May 1915 initially in the 25<sup>th</sup> Battalion, transferring to the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion while overseas. He embarked for active service on 30<sup>th</sup> December 1915 and was promoted to Sergeant on 12<sup>th</sup> March 1916. He was killed in action at the age of 21, at Pozieres, France, on the 22<sup>nd</sup> July 1916.</p>   |
|  <p>Kenneth MacKenzie Brydon<br/>[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]</p> | <p>Born 29<sup>th</sup> January 1893 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1912 in Engineering, and was awarded a Bachelor of Engineering degree on 10<sup>th</sup> May 1916. He enlisted on 25<sup>th</sup> July 1915 in the 14<sup>th</sup> Field Engineers and embarked for active service on 30<sup>th</sup> September 1916. He was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on 1<sup>st</sup> January 1916 and Lieutenant on 8<sup>th</sup> July 1917. He was killed in action at the age of 24, at Zillebeke, Belgium, on the 12<sup>th</sup> October 1917.</p>   |
|  <p>Roger James Cholmeley<br/>[University of Queensland Archives]</p>        | <p>Lecturer in Classics and Assistant Librarian he was born 4<sup>th</sup> January 1872 in England, and was a scholar of Corpus Christi College, Oxford. He served in the Imperial Yeomanry, South Africa, 1900 -1902. He joined the 13<sup>th</sup> Service Battalion, The Cheshire Regiment and was awarded the Military Cross for his actions at Messines. A published author, he was twice wounded during the war. While taking part in the post war North Russia Intervention he drowned on Lake Onega, Russia on the 16<sup>th</sup> August 1919 at the age of 47.</p>                                      |
|  <p>Leslie Norman Collin<br/>[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]</p>     | <p>Born 29<sup>th</sup> October 1894 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1913 in Arts. He enlisted on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 1914 and joined the 15<sup>th</sup> Battalion, embarking for active service on the 22<sup>nd</sup> December 1914. He was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 23<sup>rd</sup> September 1914, then Lieutenant on the 1<sup>st</sup> February 1915. He was killed at the age of 20 at Quinn's Post, Gallipoli, on the 9<sup>th</sup> May 1915.</p>  |
|  <p>William Arthur Cramb<br/>[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]</p>     | <p>A member of the University administration, he was born 10<sup>th</sup> October 1896 in Maryborough. He enlisted on 23<sup>rd</sup> July 1915 and embarked for active service on the 5<sup>th</sup> October 1915. Assigned as a Bearer, for the 7<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance, he was killed at the age of 19 at Mouquet Farm, Pozieres, France on the 26<sup>th</sup> August 1916.</p>  |

|  <p>William Frederick Donisch<br/>[University of Queensland Archives]</p> | <p>Born 11<sup>th</sup> November 1883 in Dalby. He enlisted on the 20<sup>th</sup> March 1915 in the 25<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on the 29<sup>th</sup> June 1915. He was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on 20<sup>th</sup> March 1915, Lieutenant on 1<sup>st</sup> June 1915 and Captain on the 24<sup>th</sup> February 1916. Wounded at Pozieres in France on 29<sup>th</sup> July 1916, he was killed at the age of 33 on the Somme in France, on the 14<sup>th</sup> November 1916.</p>   |
|  <p>Walde Gerald Fisher<br/>[University of Queensland Archives]</p>       | <p>Born 24<sup>th</sup> August 1894 in Horsham, he won a Government Grammar School scholarship in 1908 and a University scholarship in 1913. Matriculating in March 1913, he graduated with First Class Honours in Classics in 1916. He enlisted on the 28<sup>th</sup> February 1916 with the 42<sup>nd</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on 5<sup>th</sup> June 1916. He was appointed Lance-Corporal on 28<sup>th</sup> January 1917, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on 28<sup>th</sup> February 1917 and Lieutenant on 28<sup>th</sup> September 1917. He was killed at the age of 23 near Amiens at Sailly-le-Sec, France on the 5<sup>th</sup> April 1918.</p>                          |
|  <p>Sydney Kelso Ford<br/>[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]</p>     | <p>Born 25<sup>th</sup> October 1893 in Maryborough, he matriculated March 1913 in Engineering. He enlisted on the 14<sup>th</sup> June 1915 with the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on the 22<sup>nd</sup> January 1916. He was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on 29<sup>th</sup> October 1915 and was killed at the age of 23 at Pozieres, France on the 23<sup>rd</sup> July 1916. The Ford Memorial Prize presented by the University honours both Sydney and his brother Thomas who also died in the war.</p>  |
|  <p>Trevor Francis<br/>[Ipswich City Council Library]</p>                | <p>Born 8<sup>th</sup> June 1890 and from Ipswich, he matriculated March 1912 in Engineering. He enlisted on 24<sup>th</sup> August 1915 in the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion, eventually transferring to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on 3<sup>rd</sup> September 1915. He was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on 24<sup>th</sup> August 1915, promoted Lieutenant on 5<sup>th</sup> July 1916 and Captain on 11<sup>th</sup> November 1916. Wounded in action, he received the Military Cross for conspicuous bravery on 19<sup>th</sup> July 1916. He was killed at the age of 28 near Arras, France on the 14<sup>th</sup> March 1917.</p>                         |
|  <p>John Denis Fryer<br/>[Fryer Library]</p>                            | <p>Born 11<sup>th</sup> September 1895, he matriculated March 1915 in Arts. He enlisted on 10<sup>th</sup> June 1915 in the 52<sup>nd</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on 5<sup>th</sup> October 1915. He was appointed Lance-Corporal on 13<sup>th</sup> May 1916, promoted Corporal on 25<sup>th</sup> September 1916, appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 25<sup>th</sup> January 1917 and promoted Lieutenant on 1<sup>st</sup> July 1917. He was wounded at Hourges, France, 4<sup>th</sup> August 1918; returned to Australia 1<sup>st</sup> July 1919 but died on 7<sup>th</sup> February 1923 at the age of 27 as a result of exposure to poison gas during the war.</p> |
| <p>George Ferguson Pearman Grant</p>   | <p>Born 20<sup>th</sup> July 1894 in Aberdeenshire, Scotland he matriculated March 1914 in Science, later transferring to Melbourne University and enrolling as a Medical student. He enlisted in Melbourne on 10<sup>th</sup> October 1917 and embarked for active service on 6<sup>th</sup> August 1918. A Private in the Australian Army Medical Corps he died of pneumonia at the age of 24 at Burdon Military Hospital, Weymouth, England on the 25<sup>th</sup> February 1919.</p>   |
|  <p>Russell Walker Grant<br/>[Australian War Memorial]</p>              | <p>Russell Grant received an ad eundem gradum degree in 1911 from the university. He was born 9<sup>th</sup> May 1878 in Brisbane and enlisted on 4<sup>th</sup> September 1915 in the 25<sup>th</sup> Battalion. Embarking for active service on 12<sup>th</sup> April 1916, he had been appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on 17<sup>th</sup> January 1916 and then promoted Lieutenant on 20<sup>th</sup> September 1916. He was killed at the age of 38 near Mouquet Farm at Flers, France on the 15<sup>th</sup> November 1916.</p>  |

|  <p>Edgar Cullen 'Garry' Hall<br/>[The Armidale School]</p>                | <p>Known by family and friends as Garry, he was born 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1893 in Brisbane and matriculated March 1913 in Engineering. He enlisted on the 9<sup>th</sup> October 1915 and embarked for active service on the 30<sup>th</sup> September 1916. A member of the 1<sup>st</sup> Australian Tunnelling Company he was promoted to Sergeant 30<sup>th</sup> September 1916. He died of wounds at the age of 24 received near Hellfire Corner, Menin Road, Ypres, Belgium, on the 19<sup>th</sup> September 1917.</p>                                |
|  <p>Albert Edward Harper<br/>[St. Joseph's Nudgee College]</p>             | <p>Born 12<sup>th</sup> June 1895 in Cooktown, he matriculated March 1913 in Science. He enlisted on the 3<sup>rd</sup> August 1915 in the 4<sup>th</sup> Battalion, appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 1916 and embarked for active service on the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1916. He was killed in action at the age of 21 at Longueval, France, on the 31<sup>st</sup> December 1916.</p>  |
|  <p>Frank Granville Haymen<br/>[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]</p> | <p>Born 14<sup>th</sup> September 1891 in Toowoomba, he matriculated March 1911 in Engineering. He enlisted on the 5<sup>th</sup> August 1914 in the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion and was appointed Lieutenant on the 26<sup>th</sup> August 1914. He embarked for active service on the 24<sup>th</sup> September 1914 and was killed at the age of 23 at Gaba Tepe, Gallipoli, on the 25<sup>th</sup> April 1915.</p>   |
|  <p>Charles Chalmers Jameson<br/>[Australian War Memorial]</p>            | <p>Born 6<sup>th</sup> December 1895 in Melbourne, he matriculated March 1914 in Arts. He enlisted on the 16<sup>th</sup> September 1915 with the 42<sup>nd</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on the 5<sup>th</sup> June 1916. Promoted Company-Sergeant-Major (Warrant Officer II) on the 3<sup>rd</sup> June 1916, he was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 6<sup>th</sup> September 1916. He was killed at the age of 21 near Messines in Belgium on the 4<sup>th</sup> April 1917.</p>   |
| <p>Trevor Warwick Jones</p>   | <p>Born 2<sup>nd</sup> July 1895 in Warwick, he matriculated March 1915 in Science. Enlisting on the 16<sup>th</sup> September 1915 in the 41<sup>st</sup> Battalion, he died in Enoggera Hospital at the age of 20 on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 1916, prior to embarkation.</p>   |
| <p>Leonard Francis Macdonnell</p>   | <p>Born 23<sup>rd</sup> June 1896 in Gympie, he matriculated March 1914 in Arts. He enlisted on the 11<sup>th</sup> May 1915 in the Army Medical Corps, 7<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance, eventually transferring to the 26<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service 7<sup>th</sup> June 1915. Promoted Corporal on the 25<sup>th</sup> February 1917 and 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 3<sup>rd</sup> August 1917, he was killed in at the age of 21 in the vicinity of Broodseinde Ridge, Belgium, on the 4<sup>th</sup> October 1917.</p> |
| <p>Donald Augustus MacNeill</p>   | <p>Born 1<sup>st</sup> July 1893 and matriculated March 1912 in Engineering. Promoted to 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant, Royal Flying Corps, he was killed at the age of 23 in France, on the 18<sup>th</sup> November 1916.</p>   |



Frank Arnold Manders  
[The Queenslander, State Library of Queensland]

Born 15<sup>th</sup> June 1893 in Melbourne, he matriculated March 1916 in Arts. He enlisted on the 24<sup>th</sup> December 1915 and eventually transferred to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Pioneer Battalion. Promoted Sergeant on the 16<sup>th</sup> May 1916, he embarked for active service on the 6<sup>th</sup> June 1916 and was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 26<sup>th</sup> February 1917. He was killed in action at the age of 23 in France, on the 4<sup>th</sup> March 1917.



John Alexander Noble  
[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]

Born 18<sup>th</sup> December 1893 in Rockhampton, he matriculated March 1913 in Science. An athlete of some repute, he represented Queensland in an interstate rowing competition in 1913. He enlisted on the 21<sup>st</sup> May 1915 in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Field Artillery, eventually transferring to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Field Artillery and embarked for active service on the 27<sup>th</sup> September 1915. He was killed in action at the age of 23 at Lagnicourt, France, 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1917



Arthur Wellesley Oakes  
[SMH 1 September 1915]

Born 18<sup>th</sup> June 1886 in Wilcannia, he received an ad eundem gradum degree in 1911, and enlisted in Rosebery, N.S.W. on the 24<sup>th</sup> August 1914 in the 1<sup>st</sup> Light Horse Regiment. He embarked for active service on the 20<sup>th</sup> October 1914 and was killed in action at the age of 29 at Pope's Hill, Gallipoli, on 7<sup>th</sup> August 1915.



William Evelyn Dunsynne Rankin  
[The Queenslander, State Library of Queensland]

Born 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1888 in Maryborough, he matriculated March 1913 in Science. Enlisting on the 19<sup>th</sup> February 1916 in the 31<sup>st</sup> Battalion, he eventually transferred to the 29<sup>th</sup> Battalion. He was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 16<sup>th</sup> June 1916 and embarked for active service on the 17<sup>th</sup> November 1916. Promoted to Lieutenant on 26<sup>th</sup> May 1917, he was killed at the age of 30 at Morlancourt, France, on the 29<sup>th</sup> July 1918.



Wilfred Price Simmonds  
[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]

Born 1<sup>st</sup> March 1896 in Toowong, he matriculated March 1915 in Science. He enlisted on the 4<sup>th</sup> January 1916 in the Army Medical Corps but later was transferred to the 25<sup>th</sup> Battalion. He embarked for active service on the 7<sup>th</sup> September 1916 and was promoted Corporal on the 24<sup>th</sup> January 1917. He was killed at the age of 21 near Zonnebeke Church, Passchendaele, Belgium, on the 4<sup>th</sup> October 1917.



Harold St George Taylor  
[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]

Born 22<sup>nd</sup> March 1890, he matriculated March 1912 in Engineering. Making his way to England to enlist, he was promoted to Lieutenant, in The Border Regiment. He was accidentally killed at the age of 26 while acting as Regimental Transport Officer on the Somme, on the 15<sup>th</sup> April 1916.




William Campbell Thomson  
[The Queenslander, State Library of Queensland]

Born 10<sup>th</sup> September 1893 in Townsville, he matriculated March 1913 in Science. He enlisted on the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1916 in the 4<sup>th</sup> Cyclists Corps and embarked for active service on the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1916. He died while at sea of influenza at the age of 22 on the 8<sup>th</sup> May 1916 off Australian coast.

|  <p>Roy Cumentree Trout<br/>[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]</p>                  | <p>Born 27<sup>th</sup> January 1895 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1914 in Science and enlisted as Lieutenant on 8<sup>th</sup> August 1916 in the Australian Flying Corps. He embarked for active service on the 25<sup>th</sup> October 1916, and died at the age of 22 from injuries suffered in an aeroplane accident in Coventry, England, on the 27<sup>th</sup> July 1917.</p>  |
|  <p>Cyril Cutcliffe Ward<br/>[The Queenslander, State Library of Queensland]</p>         | <p>Born 4<sup>th</sup> December 1885 in Warwick, he matriculated 8<sup>th</sup> April 1911. He enlisted 18<sup>th</sup> April 1915 in the 26<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service 24<sup>th</sup> May 1915. Promoted to Sergeant on 29<sup>th</sup> June 1915, Company Sergeant Major on 1<sup>st</sup> March 1916, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on 23<sup>rd</sup> October 1916 and promoted to Lieutenant 8<sup>th</sup> February 1917. He was awarded the Military Cross for conspicuous gallantry in action several days before he died of wounds at the age of 32 in France, on the 8<sup>th</sup> March 1917. His brother Leslie Arnold Ward was also killed in the war.</p> |
|  <p>George Colin Campbell Wilson<br/>[The Queenslander, State Library of Queensland]</p> | <p>Born 14<sup>th</sup> January 1894 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1914 in Engineering. He enlisted 27<sup>th</sup> November 1915 in the 41<sup>st</sup> Battalion and was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 1916 prior to embarking for active service on 17<sup>th</sup> May 1916. He was promoted Lieutenant 12<sup>th</sup> May 1917 and died of wounds at the age of 23 in Belgium, on the 7<sup>th</sup> July 1917.</p>  |
|  <p>Charles Robertson Wonderley<br/>[Australian War Memorial]</p>                      | <p>Born 5<sup>th</sup> October 1894 in Toowoomba, he matriculated March 1913 in Arts and graduated with First Class Honours in Classics in 1916. He enlisted 11<sup>th</sup> March 1916, eventually serving in the 47<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service 24<sup>th</sup> January 1917. Appointed Lance-Corporal on 22<sup>nd</sup> August 1917, he was awarded the Military Medal for his actions in which he was wounded on 12<sup>th</sup> October 1917. He was killed in Amiens, France, at the age of 23 on the 5<sup>th</sup> April 1918. An uncle, Charles Robertson, who attended the Queensland Agricultural College, Gatton was killed at Gallipoli.</p>             |
|  <p>Neville Hunter Young<br/>[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]</p>               | <p>Born 27<sup>th</sup> February 1895, he matriculated March 1915 in Science. He enlisted 15<sup>th</sup> May 1916 as a Sergeant, Australian Army Medical Corps (Dental). He died at the age of 21 in Enoggera Hospital, on the 17<sup>th</sup> November 1916</p>   |

|  <p>Joseph Bertie Atkinson<br/>[Australian War Memorial]</p> | <p>Born in 1892 in Charters Towers and attended Gatton College in 1910. He enlisted 7<sup>th</sup> October 1915, initially in the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion but later transferred to the 31<sup>st</sup> Battalion. He embarked for active service 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1916, was wounded on 24<sup>th</sup> October 1916. He died of wounds at the age of 26 at Bouzincourt, France, on the 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1918.</p> |

Neil Baxter

Born in Glasgow, Scotland, he came to Australia at the age of 9 and later attended Gatton College in 1909-1910. He enlisted 16<sup>th</sup> November 1914 in the 15<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service 13<sup>th</sup> February 1915. He was killed at 21 years of age at Gallipoli on the 26<sup>th</sup> April 1915. His father, Duncan Baxter, was also killed in the war.



Louis Hugh Brimblecombe

Born 20<sup>th</sup> April 1896 in Forest Hill, he attended Gatton College 1911-1913, graduating with a Diploma. He enlisted 7<sup>th</sup> July 1917 in the 15<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service 29<sup>th</sup> October 1917. He died of wounds at the age of 22 at Villiers Bretonneux, France, on the 5<sup>th</sup> August 1918.



James Monteagle Brown

Born 6<sup>th</sup> May 1888 in Brisbane, he attended Gatton College in 1907. He enlisted 2<sup>nd</sup> August 1915, eventually ending up in the 25<sup>th</sup> Battalion. He was appointed Company Sergeant Major on the 19<sup>th</sup> November 1915, and appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 9<sup>th</sup> December 1915. He embarked for active service on the 31<sup>st</sup> January 1916 and was killed at age of 28 at Pozieres, France on the 29<sup>th</sup> July 1916.



Carl Douglas Coffin

Born in 1894 in Mackay, he attended Gatton College 1909-1911, and enlisted on the 22<sup>nd</sup> September 1914 in the 15<sup>th</sup> Battalion. Embarking for active service on the 22<sup>nd</sup> December 1914, he was killed at age of 20 at Gaba Tepe, Gallipoli on the 26<sup>th</sup> April 1915.



Errol Claude Cowley

Born in 1895 in Ingham, he attended Gatton College 1910-1913, graduating with a Diploma. He enlisted on 22<sup>nd</sup> August 1914 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Light Horse and embarked for active service on the 24<sup>th</sup> September 1914. He was wounded at Gallipoli in August 1915. On the 16<sup>th</sup> May 1916 he was promoted Lance Corporal, Corporal on 17<sup>th</sup> July 1916 and Sergeant on 12<sup>th</sup> September 1916. He was killed at the age of 21 at El Risa, Rafah, Egypt on the 9<sup>th</sup> January 1917.



Clarence Howard Culpin

Born in 1879 in Stoke Newington, England, his family came to Australia when he was 11. He attending Gatton College from 1897 to 1898 and graduated with a Diploma. He enlisted on the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1916 in the 26<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on the 21<sup>st</sup> October 1916. He was killed at the age of 38 at Buire, France on the 16<sup>th</sup> April 1918.



Hew Dalrymple

Born 15<sup>th</sup> February 1885 in Mackay, he attended Gatton College 1902-1904. Later, in June 1914, he graduated from the University of Pennsylvania with a Doctor of Dental Surgery and headed overseas shortly afterwards. A member of the 8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Somerset Light Infantry he was killed at the age of 31 at the Somme, France, on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 1916



Philip Eric Kemp Devine

Born 1<sup>st</sup> October 1893 in Pittsworth, he attended Gatton College in 1910. 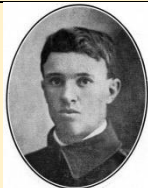
Algernon Cedric Francis

He was two months shy of his 19<sup>th</sup> birthday when he was killed at Gaba Tepe, Gallipoli on the 25<sup>th</sup> April 1915.

He was reported as missing in action, later changed to killed in action, at age of 27 at Pozieres, France, on the 29<sup>th</sup> July 1916.

Born 29 August 1897 in Townsville, he attended Gatton College in 1915. He enlisted on the 20<sup>th</sup> May 1916 in the 41<sup>st</sup> Battalion. He embarked for active service on the 7<sup>th</sup> September 1916 and was killed at age of 21 at Beschevaine, France, on the 1<sup>st</sup> September 1918.



Charles Bute Massy

He embarked for active service on the 4<sup>th</sup> October 1915 and was promoted Lance Corporal on 9<sup>th</sup> July 1916. He was killed at the age of 28, along with former Gatton student William Linedale, at Tel-el-Sheria, Palestine, on the 7<sup>th</sup> November 1917. His brother Peter also died during the war.

Once he recuperated he transferred to the 25<sup>th</sup> Battalion and again headed overseas on the 8<sup>th</sup> August 1916. He was promoted to 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on the 3<sup>rd</sup> August 1917 and was killed at age of 27 at Zonnebeke, Belgium on the 4<sup>th</sup> October 1917.



John Inglis Smith

Born 1895 in Sydney, he lived in Townsville and attended Gatton College 1913-1914. He enlisted 15<sup>th</sup> March 1915 in the 15<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on the 12<sup>th</sup> June 1915. He was killed at age of 20 at Gallipoli on 8<sup>th</sup> August 1915.

Born 1894 in Charters Towers, but was raised in Gympie. He attended Gatton College 1910-1912, and was awarded a Diploma. He embarked for active service on the 24<sup>th</sup> September 1914, was promoted Lance Corporal on the 5<sup>th</sup> May 1916, and promoted Corporal on the 18<sup>th</sup> October 1916. He was killed at age of 22 at Maghdaba, Egypt, on the 23<sup>rd</sup> December 1916.



Edward Geoffrey White

Born 1893 in Kent, England, he attended Gatton College 1910-1912. He enlisted on the 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1914 in the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion and embarked for active service on the 24<sup>th</sup> September 1914. He took part in the initial landing at Gallipoli and was twice wounded before being killed at age of 22 at Gaba Tepe, Gallipoli on the 28<sup>th</sup> June 1915.

Born 1890 in Brisbane, he attended Gatton College 1906-1909, and was awarded a Diploma. He enlisted on the 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1914 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Light Horse and embarked for active service on the 24<sup>th</sup> September 1914. Promoted Lance Corporal on the 17<sup>th</sup> January 1915, he was killed at the age of 25 at Quinn's Post, Gallipoli on the 19<sup>th</sup> May 1915.
