



Born 23rd March 1895 in Sydney, he matriculated March 1915. He came to UQ on an Open scholarship. While in high school he won an athletic prize for best all round athlete. He enlisted on 3rd August 1915 in the 9th Battalion and embarked for active service on 30th December 1915. He was promoted Corporal on 12th September 1916 and Company Quartermaster Sergeant on 16th October 1916. Died of wounds at the age of 21 in Flers, France, on the 25th February 1917. Born 29th July 1895 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1914 in Arts. Enlisting on 20th March 1915 in the 25th Battalion he embarked for active service on 29th June 1915 but returned to Australia due to sickness, eventually re-embarking on 4th May 1916. He was appointed 2nd Lieutenant on 20th March 1915 and promoted to Lieutenant on 26th June 1915. He was promoted to Captain on 8th January 1917 and was killed in action at the age of 24, in Belgium, on the 9th October 1917. Born 8th June 1895 in Taroom, he matriculated March 1914 in Arts. He enlisted on 24th May 1915 initially in the 25th Battalion, transferring to the 9th Battalion while overseas. He embarked for active service on 30th December 1915 and was Philip Gerald Browne promoted to Sergeant on 12th March 1916. He was killed in action at the age of 21, at Pozieres, France, on the 22nd July 1916. Born 29th January 1893 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1912 in Engineering, and was awarded a Bachelor of Engineering degree on 10th May 1916. He enlisted on 25th July 1915 in the 14th Field Engineers and embarked for active service on 30th September 1916. He was appointed 2nd Lieutenant on 1st January 1916 and Lieutenant on 8th July 1917. He was killed in action at the age of 24, at Kenneth MacKenzie Brydon Zillebeke, Belgium, on the 12th October 1917. [Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School] Lecturer in Classics and Assistant Librarian he was born 4th January 1872 in England, and was a scholar of Corpus Christi College, Oxford. He served in the Imperial Yeomanry, South Africa, 1900 -1902. He joined the 13th Service Battalion, The Cheshire Regiment and was awarded the Military Cross for his actions at Messines. A published author, he was twice wounded during the war. Roger James Cholmeley [University of Queensland Archives] While taking part in the post war North Russia Intervention he drowned on Lake Onega, Russia on the 16th August 1919 at the age of 47. Born 29th October 1894 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1913 in Arts. He enlisted on 23rd September 1914 and joined the 15th Battalion, embarking for active service on the 22nd December 1914. He was appointed 2nd Lieutenant on at the age of 20 at Quinn's Post, Gallipoli, on the 9th May 1915. Leslie Norman Collin






William Arthur Cramb [Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]

A member of the University administration, he was born 10th October 1896 in Maryborough. He enlisted on 23rd July 1915 and embarked for active service on the 5th October 1915. Assigned as a Bearer, for the 7th Field Ambulance, he was killed at the age of 19 at Mouquet Farm, Pozieres, France on the 26th August



Edgar Cullen 'Garry' Hall [The Armidale School]	Known by family and friends as Garry, he was born 2 nd May 1893 in Brisbane and matriculated March 1913 in Engineering. He enlisted on the 9 th October 1915 and embarked for active service on the 30 th September 1916. A member of the 1 st Australian Tunnelling Company he was promoted to Sergeant 30 th September 1916. He died of wounds at the age of 24 received near Hellfire Corner, Menin Road, Ypres, Belgium, on the 19 th September 1917.
Albert Edward Harper [St. Joseph's Nudgee College]	Born 12 th June 1895 in Cooktown, he matriculated March 1913 in Science. He enlisted on the 3 rd August 1915 in the 4 th Battalion, appointed 2 nd Lieutenant on the 1 st January 1916 and embarked for active service on the 1 st May 1916. He was killed in action at the age of 21 at Longueval, France, on the 31 st December 1916.
Frank Granville Haymen [Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]	Born 14 th September 1891 in Toowoomba, he matriculated March 1911 in Engineering. He enlisted on the 5 th August 1914 in the 9 th Battalion and was appointed Lieutenant on the 26 th August 1914. He embarked for active service on the 24 th September 1914 and was killed at the age of 23 at Gaba Tepe, Gallipoli, on the 25 th April 1915.
Charles Chalmers Jameson [Australian War Memorial]	Born 6 th December 1895 in Melbourne, he matriculated March 1914 in Arts. He enlisted on the 16 th September 1915 with the 42 nd Battalion and embarked for active service on the 5 th June 1916. Promoted Company-Sergeant-Major (Warrant Officer II) on the 3 rd June 1916, he was appointed 2 nd Lieutenant on the 6 th September 1916. He was killed at the age of 21 near Messines in Belgium on the 4 th April 1917.
Trevor Warwick Jones	Born 2 nd July 1895 in Warwick, he matriculated March 1915 in Science. Enlisting on the 16 th September 1915 in the 41 st Battalion, he died in Enoggera Hospital at the age of 20 on the 1 st April 1916, prior to embarkation.
Leonard Francis Macdonnell	Born 23 rd June 1896 in Gympie, he matriculated March 1914 in Arts. He enlisted on the 11 th May 1915 in the Army Medical Corps, 7 th Field Ambulance, eventually transferring to the 26 th Battalion and embarked for active service 7 th June 1915. Promoted Corporal on the 25 th February 1917 and 2 nd Lieutenant on the 3 rd August 1917, he was killed in at the age of 21 in the vicinity of Broodseinde Ridge, Belgium, on the 4 th October 1917.
Donald Augustus MacNeill	Born 1st July 1893 and matriculated March 1912 in Engineering. Promoted to 2nd Lieutenant, Royal Flying Corps, he was killed at the age of 23 in France, on the 18th November 1916.

Roy Cumestree Trout
[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]

Born 27th January 1895 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1914 in Science and enlisted as Lieutenant on 8th August 1916 in the Australian Flying Corps. He embarked for active service on the 25th October 1916, and died at the age of 22 from injuries suffered in an aeroplane accident in Coventry, England, on the 27th July 1917.



Cyril Cutcliffe Ward [The Queenslander, State Library of Queensland]

Born 4th December 1885 in Warwick, he matriculated 8th April 1911. He enlisted 18th April 1915 in the 26th Battalion and embarked for active service 24th May 1915. Promoted to Sergeant on 29th June 1915, Company Sergeant Major on 1st March 1916, 2nd Lieutenant on 23rd October 1916 and promoted to Lieutenant 8th February 1917. He was awarded the Military Cross for conspicuous gallantry in action several days before he died of wounds at the age of 32 in France, on the 8th March 1917. His brother Leslie Arnold Ward was also killed in the war.



George Colin Campbell Wilson [The Queenslander, State Library of Queensland]

Born 14th January 1894 in Brisbane, he matriculated March 1914 in Engineering. He enlisted 27th November 1915 in the 41st Battalion and was appointed 2nd Lieutenant on the 1st April 1916 prior to embarking for active service on 17th May 1916. He was promoted Lieutenant 12th May 1917 and died of wounds at the age of 23 in Belgium, on the 7th July 1917.



Charles Robertson Wonderley
[Australian War Memorial]

Born 5th October 1894 in Toowoomba, he matriculated March 1913 in Arts and graduated with First Class Honours in Classics in 1916. He enlisted 11th March 1916, eventually serving in the 47th Battalion and embarked for active service 24th January 1917. Appointed Lance-Corporal on 22nd August 1917, he was awarded the Military Medal for his actions in which he was wounded on 12th October 1917. He was killed in Amiens, France, at the age of 23 on the 5th April 1918. An uncle, Charles Robertson, who attended the Queensland Agricultural College, Gatton was killed at Gallipoli.



Neville Hunter Young
[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]


Born 27th February 1895, he matriculated March 1915 in Science. He enlisted 15th May 1916 as a Sergeant, Australian Army Medical Corps (Dental). He died at the age of 21 in Enoggera Hospital, on the 17th November 1916






Joseph Bertie Atkinson [Australian War Memorial]


Born in 1892 in Charters Towers and attended Gatton College in 1910. He enlisted 7th October 1915, initially in the 9th Battalion but later transferred to the 31st Battalion. He embarked for active service 23rd March 1916, was wounded on 24th October 1916. He died of wounds at the age of 26 at Bouzincourt, France, on the 23rd April 1918.







Charles Bute Massy [Gatton College Magazine, Fryer Library]	Born 1891 at Sonoma Station, Bowen River, he attended Gatton College 1909-1910. He enlisted in the 5 th Light Horse on the 2 nd November 1914 and embarked for active service on the 19 th December 1914. He was killed at age of 25 at Romani, Egypt, on the 5 th August 1916.
Kevin John Molony	Born 1887 in Yeulba, he attended Gatton College 1904-1905. He enlisted on the 26 th January 1915, initially in the 13 th Light Horse and embarked for active service 28 May 1915. He eventually transferred to the Australian Provost Corps and was awarded the Military Medal on the 14 th October 1917. He died of wounds at the age of 30 in Flanders, Belgium, on the 2nd November 1917.
Timothy James O'Neill [Gatton College Magazine, Fryer Library]	Born in 1889 in Brisbane, he grew up in Bundaberg and attended Gatton College 1906-1908, and was awarded a Diploma. He enlisted on the 10 th April 1915 in the 11 th Light Horse. He embarked for active service on the 4 th October 1915 and was promoted Lance Corporal on 9 th July 1916. He was killed at the age of 28, along with former Gatton student William Linedale, at Tel-el-Sheria, Palestine, on the 7 th November 1917. His brother Peter also died during the war.
Thomas Real O'Sullivan [Gatton College Magazine, Fryer Library]	Born 1891 in Brisbane, he attended Gatton College in 1909. He enlisted on the 23 rd February 1916 in the 41 st Battalion. He embarked for active service on the 23 rd December 1916, was promoted Lance Corporal on 23 rd August 1917, Sergeant on 26 th October 1917 and 2 nd Lieutenant on 1 st November 1917. He was killed at the age of 26 at Sailly-le-Sec, France, on the 17 th April 1918.
Noel Plunkett Power [Gatton College Magazine, Fryer Library]	Born 1893 in Gympie, he attended Gatton College 1910-1911. He enlisted on the 14 th September 1914 in the 4 th Battalion. Embarking for active service on the 20 th October 1914, he was promoted 2 nd Lieutenant on 5 th August 1916, and promoted Lieutenant on 1 st February1917. He was killed at the age of 24 at Zonnebeke, Belgium on the 4 th October 1917.
Charles Frederick Pratt [Gatton College Magazine, Fryer Library]	Born 1894 in Grimsby, England, he attended Gatton College 1911-1913. He enlisted on the 30 th September 1914 in the 9 th Battalion and embarked for active service on the 22 nd December 1914. He was killed at the age of 21 at Gaba Tepe, Gallipoli on the 28 th June 1915.
Gordon Holmes Robertson	Born 1886 in Toowoomba, he attended Gatton College in 1903. He enlisted on the 19 th August 1914 in the 2 nd Light Horse and embarked for active service on the 24 th September 1914. He was killed at the age of 29 at Gaba Tepe, Gallipoli, on the 13 th May 1915. He was an uncle to Charles Robertson Wonderley.

Graeme Lang Wilson
[Annals of the Brisbane Grammar School]

Born 1890 in Brisbane, he attended Gatton College 1906-1909, and was awarded a Diploma. He enlisted on the 2^{nd} September 1914 in the 2^{nd} Light Horse and embarked for active service on the 24^{th} September 1914. Promoted Lance Corporal on the 17^{th} January 1915, he was killed at the age of 25 at Quinn's Post, Gallipoli on the 19^{th} May 1915.
