Henry's bereft family were shattered by his death, as was evident by the number of entries in the Brisbane Courier (27 February, 1924), seven years after his death. They read:

WRIGGLES.—In loving memory of our beloved son, Henry Femister Wriggles, 41st Battalion, ALF., who was killed in action, at Armentieres, France, 27th February, 1917, aged 22 years 11 months.

A hero who played his part.

WRIGGLES.—In loving memory of my dear nephew, Henry Femister Wriggles, who was killed at Armentieres 27th February, 1917. (S. Femister)

"Until the day dawns."

WRIGGLES.—In memory of our well loved nephew and cousin, Henry Femister Wriggles, killed at Armentieres 27th February, 1917. (Mr. and Mrs. A. T. Gargett and family)

"And the shadows flee away."

WRIGGLES.—In loving memory of Henry Femister Wriggles, killed in action, 27th February, 1917, at Armentieres. Inserted, by H. Brown.


"A pal good and true."

H. Brown continued to honour his friend every year, up until 1954 some 37 years after Henry had died...


